

- eCore electronically-delivered core curriculum, completing the first two years of an undergraduate degree
- Developed by USG faculty, designers & programmers
- Taught by USG faculty
- Offered by USG institutions

OER and eCore

- Resources
 - Existing eCore courses
 - Opportunity to develop processes and models for adapting existing resources to OER
- Opportunity for Sharing
 - Courses
 - Learning Objects
 - Textbooks



Evolving Openness

- Increase Access
- Increase Affordability
- Increase Student Success



OER Project Goals

- 2000 Began developing first eCore courses
- 2002 Shared adoptable courses across the USG to faculty who were not teaching eCore
- 2003 Deconstructed the eCore courses and reassembled them into Learning Objects

History of USG OER Projects



OER in the USG

- 2004 USG SHARE Digital Repository
- USG SHARE was designed to:
 - Provide a single point of access to high quality reusable instructional resources that can be used across the curriculum to support teaching and learning within the USG

USG SHARE

- Primary focus on open educational resources (OER)
- Hundreds of open access resources
- Links to open textbooks
- Thousands of items available in USG SHARE
- Thousands more through federation with other repositories
- 2011 Repository deactivated due to lack of funding
- Redirected existing funding to Open Textbooks project

USG Open Textbooks Project

- USG Open Textbook Project
 - Develop an open textbook as proof of concept to show the benefits for using open textbooks
 - Develop a model for developing open textbooks
- Partnered with eCore, University Press of North Georgia


The 2012 Florida Student Textbook Survey reports that because of the high cost of textbooks:

- Nearly 63% of respondents reported not purchasing the textbook because of high cost
- 31% did not register for a course
- 14% of all student respondents withdrew from a class
- 7% indicated that they had failed a class

Working with University Press

- Design, develop, implement instructional strategies
- Identify and provide guidelines for structuring instructional design features and components
- Review and evaluate instructional design components
- Assist with instructional tools and technologies
- Find and evaluate existing materials
- Assist with course redesign

Working with Instructional Designer

- Create processes/procedures and team roles
- Select tools for design and development
- Templates for writing and reviewing
- Develop peer review process
- Design templates for production
- Create master list of existing resources used
- Decide on formats for production and publication
 - Editable version, PDF, HTML, ePub, iBooks, Mobi, etc.
 - Modularization
- Make it accessible


